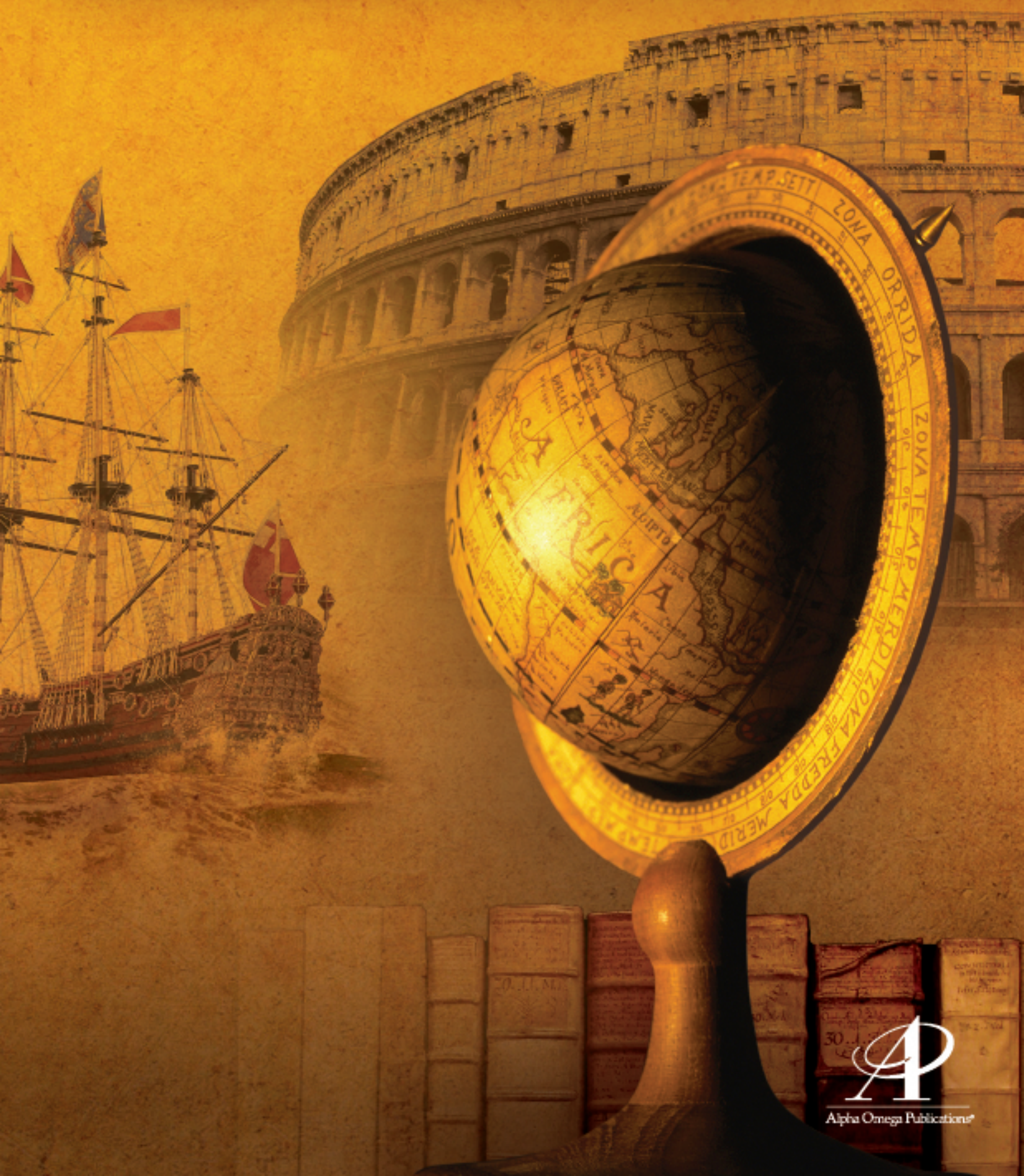

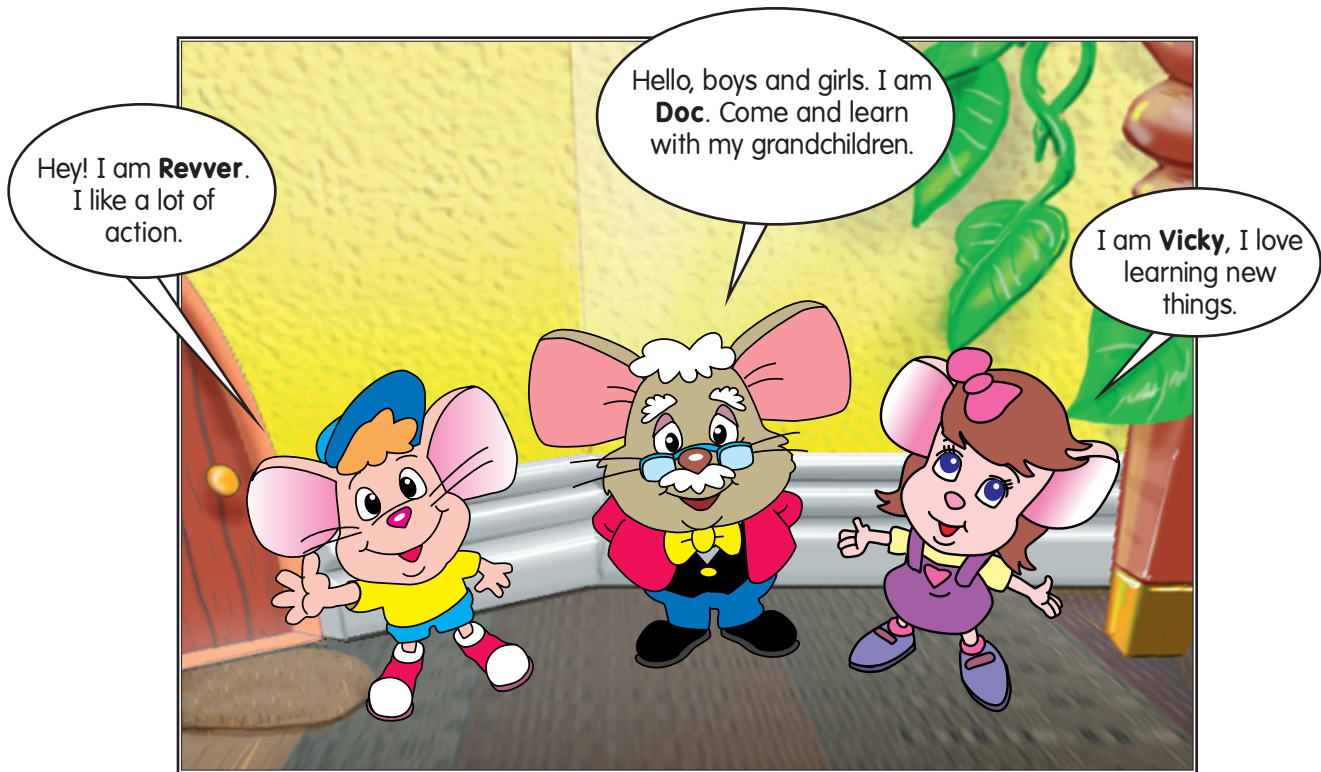
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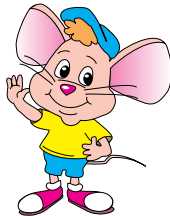

grocery (gro cer y). Place to buy food.

hospital (hos pi tal). Place where sick people are cared for.

income (in come). Money earned for doing work.

less. Not as much as something else.

lumber (lum ber). Wood cut so it can be used to build things.

meat. Part of an animal used for food.

modern (mod ern). Not old, new, up-to-date.

pioneer (pi o neer). One who goes first or does something first.

prayer. Talking to God.

price. What something costs.

rancher (ranch er). Another name for farmer.

rules. Things that tell us what to do or not to do.

seamstress (seam stress). A woman who does the work of sewing.

services (serv ic es). Work done for others.

shelter (shel ter). Something like a house that covers us from wind, rain, and snow.

shop. A small store.

sold. Given to someone for money.

tailor (tai lor). One who makes things we wear.

tender (ten der). Kind and loving.

tools. Things to work with.

vegetables (veg e ta bles). Plants from a garden used for food.

wear. To put on, as clothes.

wool. Soft hair from a sheep.
