



High School Courses of Study

While a student's course of study will reflect their own individual goals for study working with our Guidance Department, a student's typical course of study could look somewhat like the following in the college preparatory program. Course selections can be altered based upon some students earning advanced credit in 8th grade, courses transferred from another school, and other factors as the Guidance office works with the student in preparing their individual course of study.

Students earning high school credit in 8th grade with courses such as Algebra I will result in some changes to this specific course of study. A typical course of study in the college preparatory program could look somewhat like the following:

Freshman Courses – 9th Grade

Bible – New Testament

English I

Algebra I

Earth Science

Speech -.5 credit / Business Computer Information Systems - .5 credit

Physical Fitness - .5 credit/ High School Health - .5 credit

Sophomore Courses - 10th Grade

Bible – Old Testament

English II

Geometry

Biology

World History

Spanish I or French I, or elective

Junior Courses – 11th Grade

Bible Doctrine

English III

Algebra II

American History

Chemistry, or science elective

Spanish II or French II, or elective

Senior Courses - 12th Grade

Bible – Christian Faith and Living
English IV
Pre-Calculus, or math elective
Government & Economics
Physics, or elective
Elective

For an individual course of study NFC Academy will prepare a Graduation Checklist for each student beginning with their 9th grade year that will follow them until their successful graduation.

Graduation requirements by subject are the following:

- English – 4 credits starting in the 9th grade
- Math – 4 credits including required courses of Algebra I and Geometry and in some cases Algebra II.
- History – 3 credits which include credits in World History, American History, and Government and Economics.
- Science – 3 credits with Biology as a required course
- World Languages (Foreign Language) – 2 years of the same language (required for college preparatory program)
- Physical Fitness and Health – ½ credit of each
- Practical Arts/Performing Arts – ½ credit each
- Bible – 1 credit for each year in attendance at NFC Academy

Students not pursuing a college preparatory program may substitute electives for the foreign language requirement and the higher level math requirements, however 4 math credits are required for graduation thus a student not pursuing a college preparatory program would substitute other math courses for the higher level math courses. Additional substitutes may be made in the science program for Chemistry and Physics for those not in the college preparatory program.

The total credits required for graduation are 24 credits.
