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
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## Learn with our friends:




# HOW YOUR BIBLE CAME TO YOU

You like to carry your Bible to **church**.




All over the world people have Bibles to read.

**false** Not true.

**hogan** (ho gan). A Navajo house.

**holy** (ho ly). Belonging to God.

**honor** (hon or). To think well of someone.

**hospital** (hos pi tal). A place to care for the sick.

**lightning** (light ning). Flash in the sky during thunderstorms.

**mana** (man na). Food sent by God.

**message** (mes sage). Words sent from one person to another.

**missionary** (mis sion ar y). A person sent to tell others about Jesus.

**Obey** (o bey). To do what one is told to do.

**parchment** (parch ment). An animal skin made to write on.

**parents** (par ents). Mother and Father.

**promise** (prom ise). To say you will do or not do something.

**prophet** (proph et)). A person who tells what will happen before it happens.

**scribe** A writer.

**scroll** A roll on which scribes wrote.

**skin** Covering of the body.

**slave** A person who belongs to another person.

**special** (spe cial). Different, unique.

**steal** To take something that belongs to someone else.

**tablet** (tab let). Flat sheet of stone used to write on.

**Temple** (tem ple). The Jewish place to worship God.

**throne** The chair of a king.

**thunder** (thun der). The loud noise after a flash of lightning.

**tongs** A tool for picking up things.

**translate** (trans late). To change from one language into another language.

**translator** (trans lat or). A person who writes the Bible for people to read in their own language.

**truth** The right story.

**vision** (vi sion). Something seen in a dream.

**worship** (wor ship). To honor God.
